eCitation Coalition Names Steve Rauschenberger as Executive Director

CHICAGO, July 14, 2015—The eCitation Coalition, a national organization comprised of technology companies (software developers, hardware manufacturers and distributors) involved in providing electronic citation solutions to law enforcement, state and local government agencies and court systems, announced today the appointment of Steve Rauschenberger as executive director.

Rauschenberger brings a wealth of experience to the eCitation Coalition including having served for 15 years in the Illinois State Senate where he was chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee from 1994 to 2002. He is past president of the National Conference of State Legislators where he also served as co-chair of the Taskforce on Telecommunications and Electronic Commerce. Rauschenberger has prior experience in working with the Cellular Telephone Industry Association and most recently with the Electronic Payment Coalition.

Electronic citations, or e-citations, allow traffic, parking and code enforcement officers to issue and print legible, accurate parking tickets, traffic violations, and other citations on the spot and digitally transmit them quickly and accurately to court systems and other government agencies.

For law enforcement agencies, this means streamlined efficiency that allows police officers to issue a citation and be on their way in less than half the time it takes to issue a traditional paper citation. It means more time on patrol and less time standing on dangerous roads in traffic. It also means tickets are more legible, accurate and likely to stand up in court. For those receiving the ticket, it means quicker turnaround time as well as less time sitting parked on a potentially hazardous roadside.

Rauschenberger is a graduate of the College of William & Mary and serves on a number of professional and legislative boards. He resides in Elgin, Ill. with his wife of 34 years.
